- Maintains technical expertise in sectors addressed by federal actions including but not limited to water, transportation, energy and federal land management
- Reviews Environmental Assessments (EAs).
Coordinates with EPA Regional Program Staff to formalize written comments pertaining to technical and policy provisions of the EIS and project.
Collaborates with other federal agencies throughout the EIS preparation process including scoping, preliminary EIS, DEIS rating and potential referral of unsatisfactory projects to the President's Council on Environmental Quality.
Collaborates externally with tribal nations, contractors, state agencies, other Federal agencies, non-governmental organization and the public as needed.
- Advises and recommends to senior leadership in Region 8, appropriate ratings, comments and actions to be taken on specific NEPA related issues.
- Reviews Environmental Assessments for water infrastructure projects and evaluates Findings of No Significant Impact.

Functions placed in this unit include CERCLA, SARA, EPCRA and OPA activities including performance of site screening, discovery, and notification; removal and pre-remedial assessment (removal assessments, preliminary assessments, site investigations, expanded site investigations); site priority ranking and response alternatives analysis to decide NPL/non NPL track; NPL listing activities for all Regional sites (federal facilities coordinates with this group); Brownfields projects, voluntary clean-up oversight activities; classic emergency response at all sites; fund and enforcement time critical and non-time critical response activity at non-NPL sites; time critical removal actions at NPL sites as requested; oil pollution act response activities; **project officer contract placement and management activities for the Emergency Response Contracts (ERCs), project officer functions for the Superfund Technical Assistance Response Team (START) contract;** On Scene coordinator enforcement functions for both CERCLA and OPA includes working as a team with Enforcement Specialists and attorneys to obtain site access agreements, to produce administrative orders, and to participate in negotiation activities for both response and cost recovery; On Scene Coordinators oversee PRP clean-up activities and technical compliance orders, **such as technical management of Interagency Agreements with other Federal agencies that perform response work for EPA; disaster planning and preparedness including development of Regional contingency plans (RCP), coordination and assistance to the Regional response team (RRT), and Federal response plans (FRP); working with Local emergency planning commissions (LEPC), and State Emergency Response commissions (SERC) on area contingency plans and emergency exercises; reviewing; inspection and notification of violators concerning their Spill Prevention Control and Countermeasure Plans (SPCC); and chemical safety audits.**

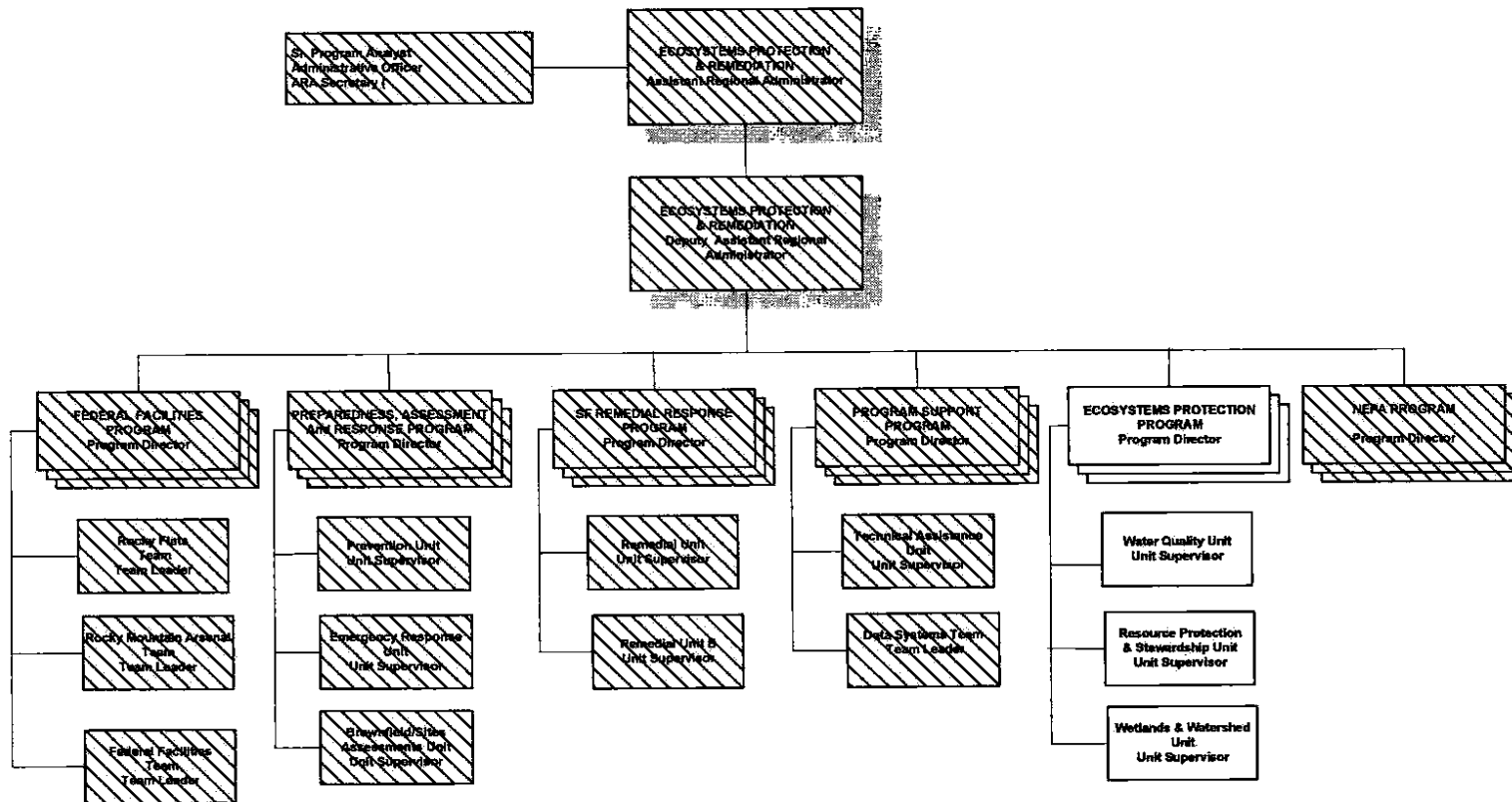

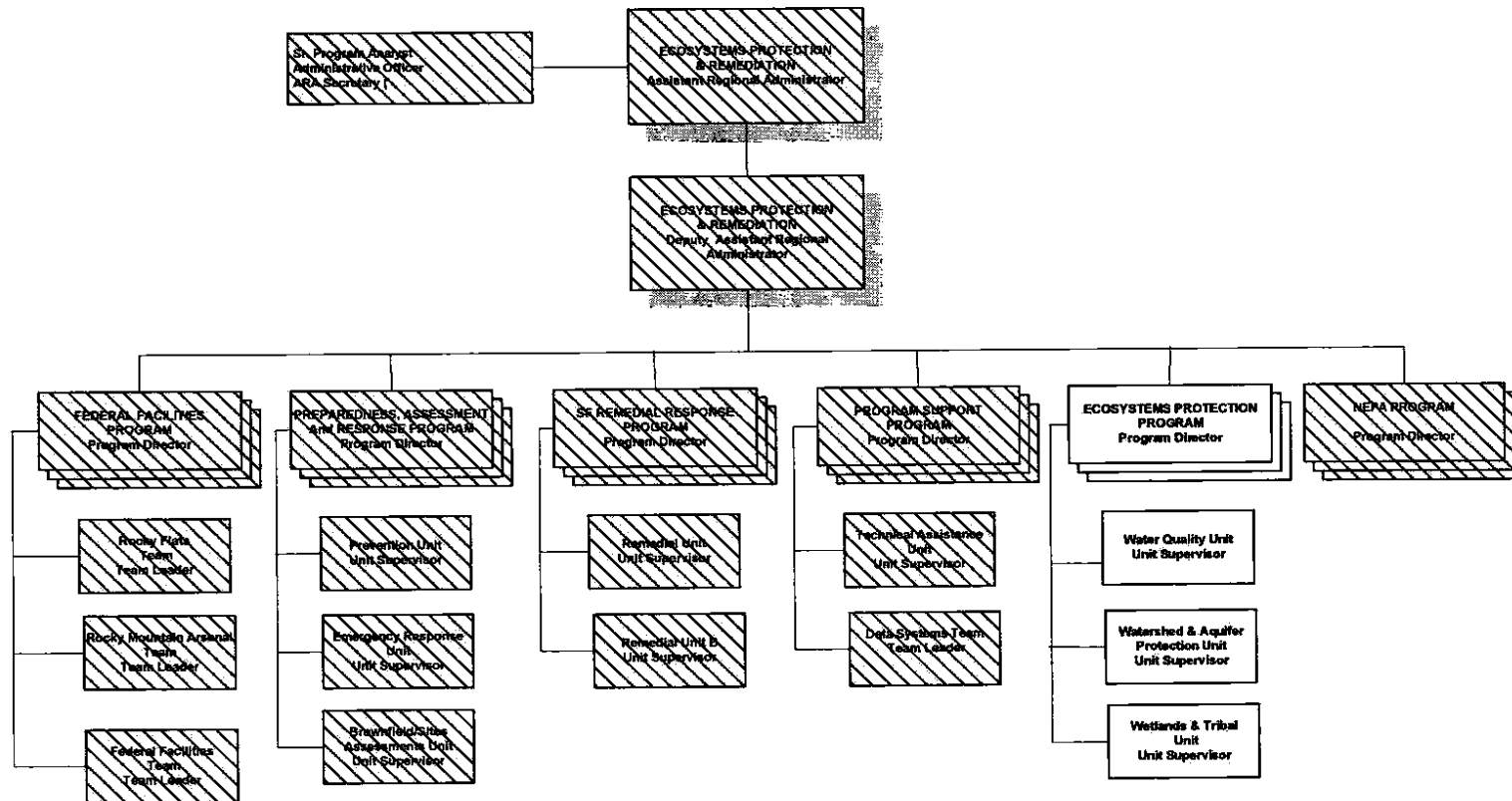

Ecosystems Protection Program

The Ecosystems protection Program will include operational and strategic functions related to ecosystem protection. The major operational functions will include:

- Water quality programs such as non-point source program oversight, clean lakes, water quality standards, monitoring, wetlands; TMDLs, stormwater permitting, whole effluent toxicity and salinity;
- Drinking and ground water programs such as source water protection activity oversight with the states and wellhead protection;
- Regional mine waste activity coordination as well as site specific work;
- Community based environmental protection activities which can be multimedia in nature, and
- Endangered Species Act coordination activities.

Strategic planning prioritization of ecosystem type activities will be coordinated from this group. There are three organizational units.

Resource Protection and Stewardship Unit

- . Responsible for the source water assessment program of the Safe Drinking Water Act
- . Responsible for wellhead protection program oversight for state programs.
- . Performs technical assistance activities for groundwater projects including restoration and remediation functions under the National Contingency Act (Superfund) authorities as well as technical assistance to non-superfund sites (mostly mining related)
- . . Provides technical assistance to the ARA for Ecosystems Protection and Remediation to fulfill our obligations to Canada on the Red River
- . Responsible for both program management and project management functions for CBEP or ecosystem projects.

- . Leads cross program teams such as the Red River or Missouri River Team or very specific but multimedia in nature projects.
- . Serves as the strategic home for CBEP for the Region, and leads the Region in developing these kinds of activities where normal statutory methods are not enough to address environmental problems in communities.

Water Quality Unit

- . Responsible for providing technical assistance to the states, tribes and other partners for activities such as monitoring, water quality standards, TMDLs, and salinity.

Wetlands and Watersheds Unit

- . Responsible for non-point source oversight of the states, clean lakes oversight, mining waste activity coordination, and wetlands/404 program oversight plus 401 certification under the Clean Water Act. .
